

Party Affiliation among Hispanic Registered Voters (%)



Annual Deportations Now Top 400,000






Democrats Have Wide Advantage among Latinos, but Share of Vote is Down from 2010 ...

% of Latino registered voters that identify as or lean toward the ...














Depth of bars is proportional to number of electoral college votes















How Donald Trump Sees The world





Mitt Romney

Former Massachusetts governor and presidential candidate

Trump met with Romney for more than an hour. He is under “active and serious consideration” to serve as secretary of state, Pence said. It is still an open question whether Romney, once a fierce critic of the president-elect, would be willing to serve in his administration.

Rudolph W. Giuliani

Former New York City mayor

Gen. David Petraeus

Retired Army general

The general is one of the most influential military officers of his generation but ended his government career as director of the CIA in November 2012 amid revelations that he had an affair with his biographer. Petraeus pleaded guilty in April 2015 to a misdemeanor charge of mishandling classified information in connection with the scandal — namely sharing information with biographer Paula Broadwell — and was sentenced to probation and a \$100,000 fine. He could face a tough Senate confirmation process because of that history, though he has since testified before the Senate Armed Services Committee as a foreign policy expert.





HOW U.S. FORCES COULD RESPOND TO A CHINESE ATTACK

Harden bases in Pacific

Allied forces would increase the number of bomb-resistant aircraft shelters and bring in runway repair kits to fix damaged airstrips.

Conduct long-range attacks


Stealthy bombers and submarines could wage a "blinding campaign," destroying long-range Chinese surveillance and missile systems and opening up the denied area to U.S. fighter jets and ships.

Disperse forces

Allied commanders would send their aircraft to remote airfields on the Pacific islands Tinian and Palau, complicating the targeting process for the Chinese.

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

North Route


- ▶ Israel has capabilities to pass Syrian radar
- ▶ Actually flying over Turkey would constitute a Turkish–Israel conspiracy to attack Iran meaning high political risk

Central route

- ▶ Jordan will not accept an Israeli flight through Jordanian airspace to strike Iran
- ▶ High risk politically and operationally due to risk of aircraft interception

South route

- ▶ Saudi-Arabia, Iraq and Kuwait would object to any violation of airspace
- ▶ Route would create high political risks though the operational risks could be low









With the Russian military intervening on behalf of separatists in eastern Ukraine, rising tensions between Moscow and the North Atlantic Treaty Organization – the US-led security alliance of western and democratic states – is likely to be a feature of the global landscape for years to come. 






Key Areas of Radical Islamic Activities Since 1992






